- A bulleted breakdown of learning objectives would be helpful for students.
 - [Added 2/3/2021:
 - Reflect on the ways race relations and blackness have been framed in Western discourses
 - Understand how race relations and blackness have been framed in Western discourses?
 - Examine how the idea and ideologies about race and blackness have evolved over time?
 - Explore the ways in which Black intellectuals and artists reacted to racial prejudice?
 - Understand how migration and globalization processes affect the discourse on blackness?
 - Enrich and consolidate knowledge about race and blackness through selected readings and material used in class and assignments.]
- To ensure consistency, recommend including the four personal days students get in the "Attendance and Participation" item of "1.List of graded work" section. The personal days are discussed later in the Grading section.[Updated: You are allowed four "personal days" for the semester, after which each absence that does not meet university criteria for "excused" will result in a one-point deduction from your final grade.]

- <u>Class participation is a critical and important component of this course. The class size</u> <u>suggested (66?) even with a TA seems large to facilitate/provide the opportunity for</u> <u>inclusive conversation and discussion/assessment. How will this be handled?</u> [To facilitate participation and discussion, students will be subdivided into small discussion group (4 to 5 students per group).]
- The syllabus states that attendance and participation constitutes 10% of the final grade. The syllabus also states that 2pt deduction will be assessed for any unexcused absence beyond the 4 personal days. Therefore, it is possible for the deductions to add up to more than 10% of the total grade which would exceed the amount stated in the "List of graded work" section. I may be a good idea to further clarify how participation and attendance impacts the final grade. For example, if there is a 10% cap on how many pts can be deducted due to unexcused absences, that could be explicitly stated.
- Suggest considering an alternative word to "incite", used for example in the statement: "This class will incite students to engage with issues of blackness and race." Perhaps based on current events, this particular word may precipitate connotations of strong negativity rather than an opportunity for students to reflect, grow, and learn from their own and other's experiences.
