 for both the GEC and students if more information were included in the beginning
 of the syllabus. [More content has been added.]
- O Please include list of required and/or recommended readings in the syllabus. As the course deals with contemporary issues and figures, students will require guidance regarding what sources they should consult about topics. [Given that this course is founded on "pop culture" is requires constant updating of materials to maintain its relevance. The readings are often in the form of introducing students to essential, trusted websites (e.g. CDC, NACHO), written content within each module, as well as journal articles.
