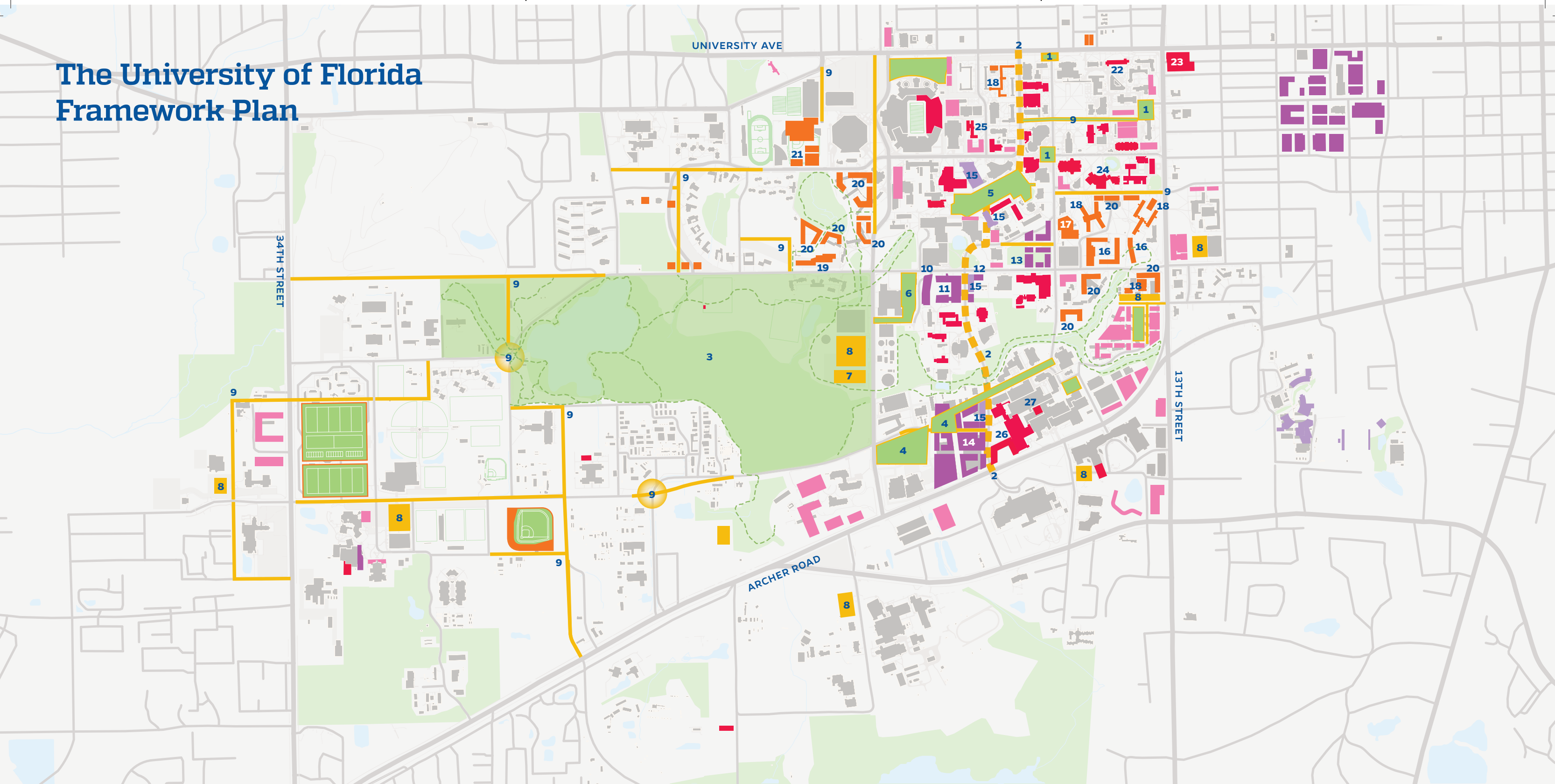

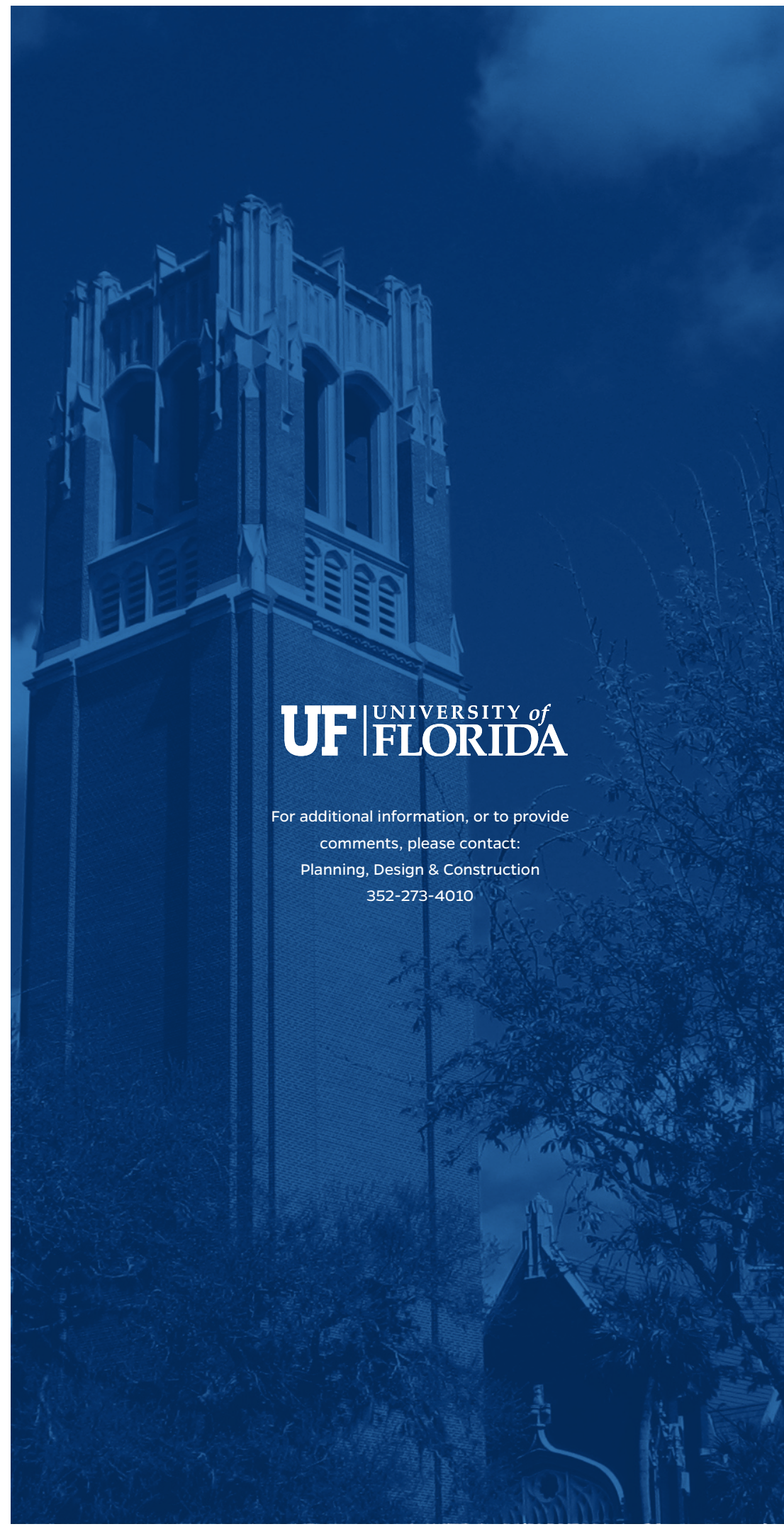
## The Student Experience
