The History Department also offers a specialization in Legal History. The specialization is open to majors (non-majors may obtain a certificate in Legal History). To successfully complete the specialization in Legal History, students are required to complete 9 credit hours, as follows:

One course must be selected from the courses listed in Group A (below). One course must be selected from the courses listed in Group B (below). The third course may be selected from either Group A or B. Students must pass each course taken for the certificate with a grade of 2.0 or higher.
