These courses must be taken from the introductory, intermediate and advanced levels of the religion curriculum and they must expose the student to both eastern and western thought. **Proposed Curriculum Changes** The department has approved an updated major, which adds a fourth option to the Religion classes that can fulfill the major requirements. The new language describing the major will read:

The program consists of 10 courses, which include at least one class in three of the following four areas: Asian religions;, one in Islam;, and one in Jewish or Christian scripture; and religion and ethics in contemporary society. In addition, all majors must complete a junior seminar on methods and theories in the study of religion and a comparative East-West capstone seminar.

The 10 courses (30 credits) for the undergraduate major in religion must be completed with minimum grades of C. These courses must be taken from the introductory, intermediate and advanced levels of the religion curriculum and they must expose the student to both eastern and western thought.

In addition to this change, the department approved a change in the number of 4000 level courses from 9 credits (3 classes) to 6 credis (2 classes).

Pedagogical Rationale/Justification The department has not changed the curriculum in many years. The chair asked the undergraduate committee to review the major curriculum in fall 2019 with the goal of updating the major to reflect recent changes in the department due to retirements, new hires, and new courses that have been added in recent years. The new version, which has been approved by the department, adds a fourth category of classes that can fulfill the major requirements: religion and ethics in contemporary society. This will give students more flexibility in the courses they can choose and it formalizes the department's growing strength in the role of religion in contemporary social and cultural processes. It will retain the breadth of knowledge that we expect of religion majors, requiring students to study a variety of traditions, regions, approaches, and issues that are important in the contemporary study of religion.

The change from 9 to 6 credits of 4000 level work is meant to create a smoother path toward completion, since 4000 level courses are not offered as regularly as 3000 level courses.

Impact on Enrollment, Retention, Graduation It will not affect students currently in the major in any way, since it adds a fourth category to the three existing ones. Students who have proceeded through the major in the current form can just choose those three existing categories to complete their major requirements. The change in number of 4000 level credits required will not affect current students. **Assessment Data Review** We reviewed the SLOs associated with the religion major
