Pedagogical Rationale/Justification Now two years old, the Sports and Media specialization in the Journalism major is being revised to 1) eliminate redundancies in the curriculum 2) add more JOU courses and 3) introduce some new coursework from the TEL major.

Impact on Other Programs We have increased the number of elective credits form within the College of Journalism and Communications from 9 to 14.

The specialization is cross-discipline in that it combines courses from JOU, TEL and PUR majors to represent the cross-discipline nature of today's sports media.

Assessment Data Review Faculty identified need to improve writing and researching skills (with the addition of Fact Finding and Multimedia Reporting courses). Writing data comes from various SLOs, while researching is a new SLO in revised curriculum.

Academic Learning Compact and Academic Assessment Plan None needed. The JOU assessment plan was just revised and approved.
