Description of	APK is proposing to eliminate the two tracks currently offered in the major (Exercise Physiology				
request	and Fitness Wellness) in order to offer a single curriculum (without tracks). In an effort to retain				
	students, we have proposed a curriculum that looks very similar to our Exercise Physiology 8-				
	semester plan, but with modifications that would not hinder Fitness Wellness-oriented students.				
	Some of these curricular modifications will require changes to the common course prerequisites				
	for our CIP (26.0908) in order to be in compliance with the articulation agreement. Since we are				
	modeling our new curriculum from our Exercise Physiology track (which is labeled track 1/2 in the				
	Common Course Prerequisite Manual), the attached request is for modifications to that track.				
	Also attached is the current common course prerequisites (PDF doc) with comments showing				
	requested edits. It is our intention to terminate both tracks if our proposed curriculum is approved.

Explanation: UF's BS degree in APK offers two tracks/specializations: Exercise Physiology (CIP 26.0908, Track 1/2) and Fitness Wellness (CIP 26.0908, Track 2/2). We are proposing to eliminate all tracks and offer a single curriculum that would absorb students in both tracks. We are using our Exercise Physiology track as the model for our new curriculum. In order to ensure that we are in compliance with the articulation agreement, we'd like to request some changes to the Common Course Prerequisites for the Exercise Physiology track (see table below).


