1. Update on Task Force Documents – Drs. Hanson and Shaw

- a. Dr. Shaw reported she is in process of completing integration of Task Force edits on the detailed Task Force report. Dr. Shaw encouraged anyone who has not yet sent changes to do so ASAP.
- b. Dr. Hanson indicated she has drafted Executive Summary, for which Dr. Lindner has provided edits. Dr. Hanson will send out to the Task Force next week.

- a. Dr. Hanson reminded everyone that the results of the Task Force's work will be presented at the December 15th meeting of the Faculty Senate. She invited Task Force members to participate in this presentation and indicated that both she and Dr. Shaw would like others to join them so that faculty and administrators are represented. Dr. Hanson asked Task Force members to let Dr. Shaw and her know if they would like to participate.
- b. Final work of the Task Force will be accomplished via e-mail, and final documents will be circulated to all Task Force members prior to submission to the Provost.
- c. Dr. Hanson thanked everyone for their service on the Task Force. The contributions of all task force members were greatly appreciated, and the overall objectives could not have been accomplished without such a hard working group.
