A discussion of possible projects and opportunities aimed at heightening campus awareness and influence of the Academy resulted in many suggestions about next year's goals. The goals discussed include self-organization and definition, reputation building, scholarly and academic stimulation and improved communication between administration and the academy. The attending members decided to accomplish the following during the next academic year:

- 1. Establish an Academy Constitution and Mission Statement
- 2. Elect officers—particularly a Secretary and Chair
- 3. Develop a Webpage (CITT was suggested as a rich source for doing this if funding can be secured)
- 4. Contribute quarterly articles to the ACADEMY PAGE of the *Faculty Development Newsletter*. Suggestions include articles on grades on campus, Honors Program credit hours, "Teaching Graduate Students How to Teach," and "Evaluating Evaluations." The first article will appear in the Fall (October) newsletter. Contact person for the newsletter is Alison Hightower (she can be reached at 392–6004 or ahightower@aa.ufl.edu).
- 5. Elect new members (number contingent upon funding and quality of applications)
- 6. Produce scholarship, grants or other support for projects: interdisciplinary funding
- 7. Bring in a Distinguished Scholar as a speaker (contingent upon funding from the Provost office—see Debra Walker King—until the Academy achieves independent funding resources).
