1. Call to Order

-Faculty Senate Chair Ray Thomas reported that proposed BOT regulations were presented at Faculty Senate on Thursday. Six regulations and one repeal were reviewed and 'lighted' with a color-coded key denoting regulation changes that may affect the senators or their faculty colleagues. -The definition of faculty in the <u>Faculty Senate Bylaws SB21</u> (p. 33) and in <u>state</u> <u>regulations</u> were discussed, including if general faculty guidelines focus on faculty assignments of: classroom instruction, research, and service to the university.

-A primary discussion consideration is to ensure that all rights afforded to faculty are equally observed and implemented within all units throughout the university.

c. Green Dot

-The need for a follow-up to item 4c in last month's <u>minutes</u> as well as continued campus messaging about the <u>Green Dot program</u> was discussed.
