Call to Order & Approval of November 19, 2020 Minutes

Sylvain Doré, Chair

- -The meeting was called to order at 3:00 p.m. by Faculty Senate Chair Sylvain Doré.
- -The minutes were approved.

Reports:

Chair's Report

Sylvain Doré, Chair

- -The Chair expressed gratitude to all medical personnel caring for COVID 19 patients and all faculty for their efforts and resilience this semester.
- -The Chair provided a furlough policy update, following its discussion at the December 4th Board of Trustees (BOT) meeting and subsequent approval at the December 14th BOT Finance, Strategic Planning and Performance Metrics Committee meeting:
- --The furlough regulation was approved at the September 29th Board of Trustees meeting.
- --Chair Doré voted in opposition to the furlough policy and outlined his and constitutents' concerns about the policy. He shared these concerns at the December 14th BOT committee meeting and at Faculty Senate.
- -The Chair continues to encourage an increased trustee focus on the 'Graduate Student Experience' and needs, including housing. All are encouraged to send constructive feeback on how to meet such graduate student goals by contacting the Faculty Senate Chair and fellow Senators.
- -In addition to the furlough policy, and graduate student housing cuts and rental rate increases, public comments entertained at the Board of Trustees meeting included the topics of COVID 19, ongoing ADA accommodations, and Spring 2021 F2F classes.
- -Engineering reports about ventilation in all classrooms and campus gathering locations for students, staff, and faculty will be shared.
- -Due to COVID, Baby Gator has reduced hours until 4:30 p.m. and reduced childcare numbers (from 344 to 240 children). In January, the number will increase to 265, and hours with be extended to 7:30 a.m. to 5:30 p.m. Baby Gator Director, Dr. Stacy Ellis, and her team reported no COVID transmissions and the Chair continues to work with Trustee O'Keefe on resolutions of long-term childcare issues.

 -Academic Policy Council (APC) Chair Hans van Ostrom, provided an overview of a newly-approved Canvas policy which aims to help faculty prepare for all teaching/instructional formats.

President's Report

- -President Fuchs discussed the arrival of the COVID vaccine on campus and its positive implications.
- -The groundbreaking for the Chris Malachowsky Data Sciences & New Technology Building took place this month. Context, including a brief overview of funding mechanisms for campus construction projects, was provided for this, as well as other campus construction projects.
- -Dr. Fuchs expressed gratitude and appreciation to the faculty for their accomplishments this calendar year.
