

**ACUA Meeting Minutes**  
**Heavener Hall - Room 306**  
**November 5, 2019 1:30-3:00 p.m.**

- I. Welcome – (Dr. Angela Lindner)
- II. Dean of Students – Updates (Dr. Heather White) – Dr. White discussed Facility Renovations and ribbon cutting ceremonies for Institute of Black Culture, Institute of Hispanic-Latino Cultures, and Hitchcock Field & Fork Pantry.
  - AAU Sexual Assault Survey – 33 AAU institutions: Undergraduate, graduate, & Professional Students participated (Last survey was 2015)
  - Key findings from 2019 – 45% of UF students experienced at least one type of harassment.
  - Student awareness of campus resources increased: Title IX office (14.6% to 44.9%), UFPD Office of Victim Services (30.7% to 60.6%), U Matter, We Care (53.4% to 73.3%).
  - Prevention and Education – Sexual Assault Prevention + AlcoholEdu, GreenDot, New campaigns.
  - Committee to begin outlining a strategic plan focused on education and prevention.
- III. Office of Admissions –Updates: 20% increase of 8,000 applications.
- IV. UF Preview –Dr. Kris Klann, Assistant Dean and Director of New Student and Family Programs, UF Dean of Students Office –
  - Transfer Preview to reflect College Session/Academic Advising in the morning and smaller rotations for presentations and Gator 1 later (see separate handout).
  - Incoming high school students with AA's: (2/3) will be approved as Freshman and remaining (1/3) will have to reapply as Transfer students.

**Action Item:** Will students have to pay the application fee twice?

- V. UF Student Success –
  - a. UF Student Success Summit Reminder, November 12 – Open registration to all Wednesday, November 6, 2019.
    - Keynote speaker is Tia Brown McNair.
    - Provost Glover has a 4min video on Student Success as well as President Fuchs will be speaking at lunch.
  - b. Students without Housing at the End of Summer Term – Dr. Jeff Citty, Director, Innovation Academy – Discussed Homeless week at UF
    - Innovation Academy sent out a survey to students about the Summer Housing – response was (14.62%) response rate.

- Students are willing to pay \$10 - \$30 per night on top of what is being paid for the storing their personal items (see separate handout).

**Action Items:** Who drives this and who should own this? How many students does this effect campus wide? Dr. Citty – Conduct a meeting to develop a plan and who will take this on to prevent homeless students in the Summer.

- c. Advisor Appreciation Week, December 2-6, 2019 – Dr. Lindner discussed that this will be an Undergraduate Reception 12/6 from 3pm – 5pm in the New Physics Building. This will be an annual event and next year we would like to involve the Graduate Academic Advisors.

#### VI. Policies -

- a. Combination-Joint-Dual Degree Policy—Lindner and Dr. Tim Brophy, UF Director of Assessment –
  - Dr. Brophy discussed that across the university terminology is different for every college with regards to Joint-Dual Degree
  - New set of standards with Degree Program length 120 – BA and 30 – Masters or combination 150 credit hours or justification of less.
  - New Policy to reflect and compliment with SACS standards
- b. Status of Online Proctoring – Brian Marchman, Assistant Provost and Director, Office of Distance Learning
  - Dr. Marchman discussed Online Proctoring – Best practices, when an assessment equivalent to 15% or more of a student’s final course grade should utilized an online authentication and proctoring solution.
  - ProctorU and Honorlock are the contracted partners
  - Summer 2019 Academic Integrity Data: 154 total student incidents referred to Dean of Students Office for Honor Code violations. 60 of those incidents were in online courses which was 39% of summer total
  - There is no penalty for late registration of exams using the contracted partners and UF does not want to pass additional charges to the student.

#### VII. Precollegiate Education and Training – Dr. Mary Jo Koroly, Director, CPET

- Dr. Koroly discussed different programs to are designed with teachers to improve science education and career exploration of precollege students reaching throughout the state.
- Teacher Programs in Florida are funded by NIH Grants and NSF to handle Summer Science Week Programs for precollege students.
