Direct assessment of our SLOs comes from an approved department rubric used for individual evaluation of each student. Successful mastery of all SLOs is measured by satisfactory (minimum grade of C) performance on exams, papers and other course work for six hours of credits in core psychology natural sciences (course prefixes CBH, EAB, EXP and PSB), six hours of core psychology social sciences (course prefixes CLP, DEP, SOP and PPE) and three or four hours of psychological research methodology, design and analysis, graded by department rubric. Instructors of the above courses use a specific grading rubric that involves rating each student's performance as outstanding, satisfactory, or unsatisfactory on exercises and/or short assignments, tests/exams, and major projects or papers. This specific rubric is shown below:
