Discussion:

Writing Requirement (Gordon Rule)

- 1. Belief Statement revised to read, "We believe that all students should be able to express in clear, concise prose, the key themes, principles, and practices in their discipline".
- 2. The "Least Disruptive Implementation" appears to be the most practical proposal.
 - a. The 2000 and 4000 levels will be included, in addition to the 6000 words per course.
 - b. Council affirmed that papers must be revised.
 - c. The specified percentage of class time on writing will be eliminated.
 - d. The specified percentage of grade based on writing will be relative to the word level (2000, 4000, 6000).

The Least Disruptive Implementation will be reviewed again at the next meeting.
