General Education Council Minutes March 26, 2004

Discussion:

Proposals presented to the University Curriculum Committee were discussed and it was noted by Yumiko Hulvey that the Romance Languages Department was not supportive of the I1, I2, I3 proposal. There was concern that the Spanish department would dominate enrollment if the department sought and was approved for I designation for their courses.

Council members were encouraged to consider topics for the annual report.

Council approved revision to the word count per page to 300 for Writing Requirement credit

Regarding WR credit awarded for AP exams, the Council supports awarding E6 credit for test-equivalent courses <u>only</u> when the University Curriculum Inventory records those courses as WR/E6. These include ENC1101, ENC1102, AML2070, ENL2022, EUH2001, AMH2010 and AMH2020. Students receive a maximum of E6 per exam and have the potential to fulfill the WR (E24) by scoring 4 or higher on 4 exams, English Lang. & Composition, English Lit. & Composition, European History, and US History. The Council discussed a cap on E6 awards and will re-consider at a later time.

Courses:

CHM1025, Introduction to Chemistry, P, Tabled.

Several questions – has this course come before the Council before, is it S/U, are 2 credit courses eligible for gen ed?

GEO2XXX, Extreme Weather, P, Denied.

Course appears to be at the survey level without sufficient rigor to qualify for general education classification.
