All (4) assignments and the required hours must be completed at a satisfactory level to receive credit for the practicum experience. Failure to satisfactorily complete all assignments and the hours will result in an unsatisfactory grade.

Students must earn a satisfactory evaluation from their site supervisor in 60% of the required evaluation categories on the Mid-term evaluation and must earn a satisfactory

evaluation from their site supervisor on 80% of the required evaluation categories for the Final evaluation.

Students must complete a minimum of 48 clock hours for each credit registered; up to 144 clock hours and 3 course credits during the semester.

The number of potential hours to be completed and the number of credit hours for which you will register is to be determined PRIOR to the start of the semester. Your site supervisor will need to validate your plan in advance of the practicum.
