Specialization in Sociology between the residential program and the UF Online program. Some courses offered to the residential students may not yet be available in the UF Online program.

Pedagogical Rationale/JustificationWe believe this major (GBA) provides students with the opportunity to gain a foundation in business while simultaneously pursuing multi-disciplinary interests outside of business. Merging business with other fields is pragmatic for employability.

The GBA major has already been approved to be offered in UF Online. The present proposal is requesting the addition of a specialization in Sociology.
