Pedagogical Rationale/Justification: This course configuration allows online Finance majors to complete an equal number of Finance courses to the campus Finance major while harnessing the current structure of the online General Business major.

Impact on Existing Residential and Online Programs: Offering the Finance major in UF Online should have no impact on any existing

residential undergraduate programs. There could be a slight positive impact on enrollment in the Accounting minor, as any student who

completes this major will meet the prerequisites to apply for the Accounting minor (residential or online). The ability of online business students to major in Finance could help attract prospective online business students to UF versus other schools.

Business Administration: Finance with a Track in Real Estate General Business, BSBA

The online Bachelor of Science in Business Administration-General BusinessFinance with a track in Real Estate (BSBA-FINHBA ONL) degree program, which provides a broad overview of the functional areas of business with an emphasis in finance and real estate, is designed for students who live outside the Gainesville community or have work and/or family commitments that make traditional campus attendance impractical. Students take foundational courses in economics, mathematics, computing skills and accounting; core courses that relate to the basic functions of business, such as finance, management, marketing and operations management; and major courses that develop students' financing and real estate decision-making skills, and professional development courses such as business communication and career management.

Critical Tracking


