Certificate Description Historical exploration of law in society. Introduces students to the ways in which law influences society, and the ways in which society influences law. By requiring students to study legal histories of countries outside the US (Group B), the certificate encourages them to consider how law works around the world.

Requirements for Admission Current UF undergraduates. 2.0 GPA, completion of 1 history course at the 2000 level or above. Open to students in any major, including history majors. Students minoring in history are eligible for the certificate so long as none of their certificate courses are counted towards their minor.

Requirements for Completion Students are required to complete 9 credit hours, as follows:

One course must be selected from the courses listed in Group A (below). One course must be selected from the courses listed in Group B (below). The third course may be selected from either Group A or B. Students must pass each course taken for the certificate with a grade of 2.0 or higher.

Rationale and Place in Curriculum This certificate helps identify a collection of courses offered by the History Department, allowing students to see connections between them. It builds on the department's strength in legal history in a way that makes legal history courses attractive to majors and non-majors who might otherwise not consider history courses. It offers training for students who are considering law school, and an opportunity for students who are interested in becoming more informed participants in our political and legal culture.

Student Learning Outcomes 1. Students will learn how to read and interpret legal materials, including cases, statutes, and constitutions. Assessed through written assignments over the course of the semester.

2. Students will explore how law is shaped by social forces and how law shapes society. Assessed through assignments over the course of the semester.
