COURSE DESCRIPTION The honors seminar provides a unique and challenging experience for students who have exhibited exceptional academic ability to enhance the development of creativity and the ability to engage in scientific inquiry. The honors seminar provides opportunity in research, service projects, and other creative endeavors in association with professionals in various fields of study. Emphasis is given to consideration of innovative approaches to problem solving in health care.

COURSE OBJECTIVES Upon completion of this course, the student will be able to:

1. Evaluate own participation in the implementation of a research or other creative project in nursing or in other health care fields.
2. Analyze issues related to participation in and presentation of scholarly projects.
3. Engage in the critical analysis of selected traditional and innovative problem solving processes.

TOPICAL OUTLINE

1. Review several types of research approaches and ways of seeking solutions.
2. Ethical constraints in clinical outcomes studies.
3. Methodological issues in gaining access to potential subjects and project clientele from at risk populations.
4. Methods of communicating research conclusions and project outcomes.
5. Creative and innovative approaches to the identification of and solutions to problems affecting health care.

TEACHING METHODS

Seminar. Student-directed participation in reflective discussion and activities that support ongoing research studies or service/creative projects under the guidance of faculty scholars.

LEARNING ACTIVITIES

Participation in faculty supervised research project or advanced service project; participation in individual and group presentations; write and present an honors thesis or project topic.

CLASS ATTENDANCE AND MAKEUP POLICY

Collaborative learning is an essential component of this course, therefore, attendance is expected at all scheduled class sessions. Advanced notice of absence is expected. In general, acceptable reasons for absence from or failure to participate in class include illness, serious family emergencies, special curricular requirements (e.g., professional conferences **with advanced notice**), military obligation, severe weather conditions, religious holidays, and participation in official university activities. Absences from class for court-imposed legal obligations (e.g., jury duty or subpoena) are excused. Makeup assignments for excused absences will be negotiated with the instructor. **If at all possible**, the course instructor must be notified in advance if an exam is missed due to an extenuating circumstance. If no notice is given or without prior approval of an absence for a reason listed above, a grade of zero will be assigned. Students may not opt out of any exams.

LATE ASSIGNMENTS

Students are expected to plan in advance and submit assignments by posted due dates. There will be a 10% deduction per day on late assignments. After 3 days, you will receive a zero on the assignment unless you approved in advance by your instructor.
