Dear Dr. Janelle—I am writing today in my capacity as Undergraduate Coordinator in Women's Studies, where we administer the minor Health Disparities in Society. One of your department's courses, HSC 4624 Trends in International Health, currently counts in the minor as a category three elective (you can see more info here).

Over the past 18 months, a committee has worked on refining the HDS minor based on what we have learned in the past five years of offering the minor, advances in the field toward more explicit structural analysis and equity/justice framing, and changes in course offerings at UF. Among multiple refinements to the minor, one change we are proposing is to our elective structure. We have developed a new description of the elective category, "Health Systems and Social Justice Mission," which now includes course options that focus explicitly and substantially on how health systems are connected with equity and justice issues; that is, each course reflects a focus on both health systems AND equity and justice (rather than either/or).

The committee reviewed existing course descriptions and syllabi that were available online. Based on that information, and in line with the proposed modification, we have proposed dropping HSC 4624 from the list of approved electives from the minor.

The minor modification proposal went before the UCC recently and that committee requested that we seek a consultation from HHP about dropping this course. Could you please let me know if you have any concerns with this proposed drop? I'm also happy to talk on the phone if you would like me to clarify anything about this request. Thanks. -Alyssa
