Proposed Changes The Hebrew minor currently allows students to select their 9 credits of electives freely from a selection of courses offered by LLC and by other departments. We would like to reconfigure the electives section of the minor, requiring that students select among their electives at least two 3000/4000 level courses offered by LLC's Hebrew specialization (HBR/HBT/HMW prefix courses).

Pedagogical Rationale/JustificationThis change is intended to ensure that Hebrew minors graduate with a more rigorous and profound knowledge of Hebrew language and culture. Specifically, we would like to guarantee that students minoring in Hebrew benefit from a more intensive engagement with Israel's literary and more broadly artistic and mediatic culture in addition to a knowledge of the socio-political realities of a life lived in Hebrew.
