Proposed Changes:

Eliminate one Physical Science and lab required by the BA. When the BA was created, we assume that it copied the requirements of a liberal arts degree. This science course and lab is not required to graduate.

Beginning Makeup (1 credit), and Dance Appreciation (3 credits) will be converted to theatre electives and not required courses. This allows Introduction to Light and Sound (4 credits) to be added as a required course for BA's. Lighting and sound is a lucrative field and a valuable core skill for our theatre graduates.

In tracking, some courses were moved from spring to fall and vice versa to accurately reflect when those courses are available.
