- 3. Switching the semester an elective is offered balances the credit load.

**Impact on Enrollment, Retention, Graduation** The changes should not impact enrollment, retention or graduation.

**Assessment Data Review** These changes will allow the program to better address SLO 1 by introducing concepts from the general body of knowledge in an improved order and SLO 2 by offering a more advanced professional skills-building course.

Student work shows strength in ecologically based planning and design, urban issues and conservation; all of strategic concern in Florida and elsewhere.

Educational options include an eight-month internship, focused electives for individual specialization, competitions, and interdisciplinary certificates in historic preservation, sustainable design, geographical information systems (GIS) and wetlands. Studies abroad in landscape architecture include an international service learning exchange summer program in Southeast Asia.

Required field trips broaden and expand students' educational experiences. Students may also be required to attend state and national professional meetings.
