Rationale and Place in Curriculum More than 744 million people worldwide, and 3.5 million Americans, including 200,000 in Florida alone, have been diagnosed as having Autism Spectrum Disorder (ASD), according to the U.S. Centers for Disease Control (CDC). ASD is a lifelong developmental disability that is characterized by a range of social, communication and behavioral challenges and symptoms. Persons with ASD have abilities on a spectrum from gifted to severely impaired. Whereas some individuals with ASD need assistance with daily life skills, others lead relatively or completely independent lives.

This Certificate is needed at the University of Florida because ASD is so prevalent in our society that professionals in diverse fields including psychology, medicine, education, nursing, mental health, public health and business need training in order to have successful interactions with their patients, clients, customers and employees who have ASD.

The growing awareness of ASD and the needs surrounding it are evidenced at UF, for example, by student-led organizations that support individuals with autism in the community and university-based resources designed to meet the need of students with ASD. Clients served by the University of Florida Center for Autism and Related Disabilities (UF CARD) include UF faculty, staff and students as well as individuals from other Florida colleges and universities.

This certificate provides formal curricular training as a foundation for providing improved care. policymaking, support and resources for people living with ASD and their families. In this light, this certificate is appropriate not just for educational institutions, but also for businesses, faith-based organizations, other nonprofit organizations, policy makers and other stakeholders.

UF is well poised to offer this critically-needed training because of the breadth of its expertise in related basic science and clinical research, education and patient care, as well as infrastructure and resources. UF recently hired Preeminent Scholars with expertise in autism. UF CARD has provided resources, training and assistance to professionals in Florida for the past quarter century. Instructors in this certificate program are highly qualified faculty and staff from the College of Medicine, Department of Psychiatry who lead the UF CARD. All four of the main instructors have PhDs in Education or Psychology and many years working in the field of autism. Included are the Executive Director, Director, Associate Director and Assistant Director, respectively, of UF CARD, who are recognized throughout Florida, the U.S. and the world as leaders in the field. Guest instructors and collaborators will include other leaders in the field from UF and around the U.S.

Student Learning Outcomes All outcomes listed below will be assessed across the program (component courses will each assess a subset of the list).

- 1. Discuss historical and global trends in ASD prevalence and diagnosis
- 2. Outline the characteristics of ASD and associated conditions
- 3. Describe formal and informal strategies for assessment of the following domains: speech and language, communication, social-emotional, psycho-motor, sensory, and cognitive areas of development
- 4. Recognize the instruments and processes used for a comprehensive evaluation
- 5. Outline issues related to family and community living for individuals with ASD
- 6. Outline issues related to service provision across contexts for individuals with ASD
- 7. Distinguish the core features, associated conditions and co-morbid disorders associated with ASD
- 8. Classify the multiple lines of evidence that support a genetic etiology of ASD
- 9. Identify risk factors for ASD
- 10. Identify key biomarkers from both peripheral systems as well as the central nervous system associated with ASD
- 11. Classify key brain regions and neural circuitry by the core features associated ASD
- 12. Illustrate key neurobiological mechanisms that appear to mediate the development of ASD-like behaviors that have been identified from specific animal models of ASD
- 13. Create a plan for implementing evidence-based practices for an individual with ASD given presenting characteristics
- 14. Explain how to use preventative strategies to create a supportive learning environment for individuals with ASD
- 15. Use the principles of applied behavior analysis to assess and develop programs to address the challenging behaviors of individuals with ASD
- 16. Identify communication and language challenges often associated with individuals with autism and implement appropriate strategies to foster the development of language and social skills in both structured and naturalistic learning situations
- 17. Describe several well-known teaching programs for autism, including explaining the pros and cons of each methodology
- 18. Evaluate, compare, contrast evidence-based medical treatments in ASD
- 19. Describe education and treatment outcomes for individuals with ASD
- 20. Explain methods and procedures for supporting families and caregivers
