- 1. Approval of minutes of the February 27, 2007 meeting: The minutes were approved.
- 2. Proposed request for credit transfer approval in the Department of Classics: Lynn Frazier of UFIC and Karelissa Hartigan from Classics explained this proposal. The request is for UF to become the "school of record" for both UF and non-UF students, granting UF credit as the school is not accredited. Courses are offered across the curriculum, not just in Classics. Andy McCollough and Lynn Romrell suggested an amendment that only courses specifically reviewed and approved by UF can be recorded as UF course work. McCullough motioned to table until April meeting, the motion was seconded. In April, reconsiderations will include the number of non degree students and where they are coming from, and the SACS position on "school of record". UF students can continue to participate. The issue is whether UF wants to be the school of record for other schools.
- **3.** Proposal to change course requirements for the Sales Engineering minor: Dr. Abernathy clarified the communication issue. The changes were approved.
- **4. Proposed modification of BS Degree in Nuclear and Radiological Sciences:** Dr. Abernathy clarified the modification. Most majors already take APK courses, so the increased demand will be minimal. Lab space is the limiting factor. The modification was approved.
- 5. Proposed revision to upper division curriculum for the Forest Resources and Conservation (FRC) major in the College of Agricultural and Life Sciences: Deferred to April.
- 6. Information item from the College of Liberal Arts and Sciences: changes in course content in BSC 2010 and BSC 2011: Dr. Matheny and Dr. Hulvey explained this item. These changes bring UF into sequence with other AAU institutions. They are currently working on how to advise students.

7. Approval of the Academic Calendar for 2011-2012: A late spring break is a problem for modular courses, clinics (PH & HP), and makes it difficult for students to re-engage so late in the term. There was a motion to recommend to the Academic Policy Council that Spring Break be March 3-10 for 2011-2012. Dr Dickison and Steve Pritz will meet with them. This motion was approved. The calendar was not yet approved.

8. Information only items from Graduate School: No action required

- Proposal to allow faculty in non-graduate-degree-granting programs to hold Graduate Faculty status.
- **9. Notice of proposed new undergraduate courses**: A motion to accept all proposed new courses was approved.

10. Notice of proposed changes to undergraduate courses: Information item.
