1. Approval of minutes of December 15, 2009 meeting.

The minutes were approved.

2. Update from Faculty Senate.

Dr McLeskey, the Faculty Senate appointed co-chair of the UCC is on sabbatical for the spring term. Dr Koro-Ljungberg will serve out the balance of his term as co-chair this semester. She will also represent Dr Mair at this week's Faculty Senate meeting.

3. Proposed changes to the Applied Physiology & Kinesiology curriculums, effective Summer B (changed from Fall) 2010.

Dr McCormack Brown explained this is an update to approved electives. This proposal was approved.

4. Proposed changes Proposed Changes to the Athletic Training Curriculum, effective Summer B 2010.

Dr McCormack Brown explained this proposal involved re-sequencing of upper division courses. This proposal was approved.

8. Proposed changes to the Sport Management Curriculum, effective Summer B 2010.

This proposal was tabled by the college for clarification regarding the use of independent studies courses to meet the department elective requirement.

This item is "clean up" for course renumbering changes in the state system. This proposal was approved

10. Proposed changes to the Exercise Physiology and Fitness/Wellness Curriculums, effective Summer B 2010.

Dr McCormack Brown relayed that this change will increase the options of courses students may take. This proposal was approved.

11. Proposed new Minor in Accounting, effective Fall 2010.

Dr Ray explained that this proposed minor is in response to industry demand, most specifically directed at Finance majors. This proposal was approved.

12. Proposed changes to the Business Core Requirements for the BSBA and BABA Degrees, effective Summer B 2010.

Dr Ray explained that a core course (ECP 3703) is being eliminated, and the changes will address this change. The proposal was approved.

13. Proposed changes to the requirements for the following majors: Management, Marketing, and Economics, effective Summer B 2010.

Dr Ray relayed that these changes are creating additional depth in the upper division major courses for these majors. The proposal was approved.

14. Proposed revision of the 3000-4000 level restricted elective requirements for the following BSBA Majors: Economics, Finance, Information Systems, Management, and Marketing, effective Summer B 2010.

Dr Ray explained that these changes will allow more flexibility in the upper division electives for these majors. The proposal was approved with the clarification that only one <u>business</u> electronic platform course can be included as an upper division elective.

15. Proposed request for program closure of BA in American Studies, effective Summer B 2010.

Dr Mair clarified that this program has not had any students or faculty in many years, and this action is to cleanup what is already happening. This proposal was approved and will be forwarded to the Faculty Senate for action.

16. Proposed two BS degree programs for Agricultural & Biological Engineering, effective Summer B 2010.

Tabled at the request of the college.

17. Proposed changes to BS curriculum in Civil Engineering, effective Summer B 2010.

Dr Law clarified that while this change will eliminate tracks within this major, students will still have many options for specialization by their course selections. The proposal was approved.

18. Proposed changes to BS curriculum in Nuclear Engineering Sciences, effective Summer B 2010.

Dr Law explained that this modification is in response to changes suggestions made by their credentialing authority. The proposal was approved.

19. Proposed changes to Packaging Science Minor, effective Summer B 2010.

Dr Turner related that this change will simplify the minor requirements and afford more flexibility to students pursuing this minor. The proposal was approved.

20. Proposed changes to Packaging Science Major, effective Summer B 2010.

Dr Turner explained that in response to industry expectation of students with this degree, they have added additional technical requirements. This proposal was approved.

21. Discussion of approval process for 5000 level courses.

After discussion, it was agreed that 5000 level new course request and course changes (joint graduate and undergraduate courses) will be voted upon by the UCC after they have been approved by the Graduate Curriculum Committee. This is effective beginning immediately.
