**Differences from Residential Program:** The minor is divided into two blocks: general

communication theory classes (Block 1, students take four of five classes) and quantitative classes (Block 2, students take one class of four). The Online version will substitute a new course, MMC 3420, Consumer and Audience Analytics, for the ones we

currently offer in Block 2).

**Pedagogical Rationale/Justification:** A communication minor is a perfect complement to UFO, as enhanced communication skills are a value in almost every applied field. We believe the courses offer students from a variety of majors insights into how they can be more effective at a) developing strategic messages, b) produce such messages, and c) analyze data for determining the effectiveness of the messages. We have found that such skills are in heavy demand among individuals entering STEM fields and business.

**Impact on Existing Residential and Online Programs:** The expected impact is minimal. Many students in other UFO majors need courses outside of their relevant departments to complete their degrees. This minor offers a coherent set of classes that can meet that need and enhance the skills of graduates from a variety of fields as they enter the job market.

Applicants must have a minimum cumulative 3.0 GPA and receive approval of their college's dean before obtaining Journalism and Communications college approval in 1000 Weimer Hall.
