Description	The Professional Certificate in Shelter Medicine requires students to complete 3 online courses, 2 externships, and 1 clerkship. This request adds one additional newly approved clerkship, VEM 5863 Shelter Practice Clerkship, as an option for fulfilling the required clerkship. This is the only change to the Professional Certificate and is needed because the prior two options (VEM 5890 Consultation Clerkship and VEM 5891 VCOP Clerkship) do not have enough seats to ensure the large number of veterinary students interested in the clinical training can enroll. By having an additional option, more students will be able to complete the requirements of the Professional Certificate in Shelter Medicine.

Impact on Program: This will give students an additional course choice so they have more options to fulfill the required clerkship and a better chance of getting a seat in an approved clerkship course during their clinical year.

Rationale for Proposed Change(s): As the size of the student body in vet med has increased, it has become difficult for students to schedule the required clerkship needed to fulfill the requirements of the Professional Certificate in Shelter Medicine. This newly approved Shelter Practice Clerkship, VEM 5863, will give students a third approved choice to fulfill the clerkship requirement and will provide additional opportunities for students to enroll during their clinical year of training.
