Current Certificate Description The undergraduate certificate in Dance in Medicine recognizes students' special competency and achievement in the use of movement to enhance health in community or healthcare settings. This certificate can serve as a credential for developing career options for dancers and will expand the professional applications of dance to promote health. Students should apply by their junior year and contact the center director to schedule an initial meeting to discuss requirements.

Students must attain a 3.0 GPA in the required courses, all of which have prerequisites.

Impact on Program The HUM courses are currently being offered by the Arts in Medicine curriculum and have capacity for these certificate students. The DAN and DAA offerings in the School of Theatre and Dance also have capacity for these certificate students.

Rationale for Proposed Change(s) The rationale for changing the curriculum is due to curriculum changes that are occurring in the School of Theatre and Dance. The proposed revision focuses less

on dance proficiency and more on professional development and career readiness specifically, how to utilize dance to support and promote well-being. In addition, the proposed revision will enable more non-dance major students to complete the certificate. The number of pre-req credits that non-dance majors must complete before starting the certificate can range from 2-5.

Students will gain the skills necessary to facilitate practice in healthcare and community settings through completing the Dance in Medicine and Practicum courses. Introduction to Arts in Medicine in a Global Context will provide students with a basic understanding and overview of the field of arts in health. The studio course and Dance Appreciation or Dance Fundamentals courses will provide students with an adequate foundation in dance to meet the skills necessary for the certificate.

Assessment Data Review Current Program Goals:

1. Recruitment/enrollment: to recruit and retain 5 undergraduate certificate students per year.
2. Program Development: to offer an undergraduate certificate curriculum in arts in healthcare that prepares students to plan or develop professional careers in the field.
3. Student Learning Outcomes/Assessment: to accurately assess student learning through appropriate course and practical assessment methods.

Current SLOs:

1. Identify and explain the ways in which dance has been used to enhance health and healing in traditional cultures as a context for the contemporary practice of the arts in medicine.
2. Identify and acquire the skills necessary to function as an artist in community and/or healthcare settings, including skills that ensure patient safety, appropriate facilitation of dance, and appropriate self-care.
3. Students articulate and appraise the scope of arts in healthcare practice in the context of related disciplines, such as dance therapy.
4. Students describe effective research methodologies and how they apply to the dance discipline.
5. Illustrate effective communication in verbal and written form.

Academic Assessment Plan Changes We would like to make the following adjustments:

PG 1: "Retain 5 undergraduate certificate students per year"

PG 2: "Advance the caliber of our students and create a feeder into the graduate program.

PG3: Maintain consistent assessment revisions across the curriculum.

We would like to make the following changes to SLOs:

- 1) Identify and explain theoretical frameworks and professional practices within the field of arts in health
- 2) Identify and acquire practical skills and professional competencies related to facilitation of dance in healthcare settings and to promotion of health in community settings
- 3) Identify and appraise the scope of dance practices in the context of related disciplines, such as dance therapy
- 4) Conduct research utilizing the appropriate research methodology
- 5) Eliminate this SLO completely

Certificates must contain at least nine credits of coursework that are unique to that program out of all other certificates and minors.

This certificate is unique because you will have access to these types of learning experiences: hands-on practical experience with patients and/or community members, exposure to arts in health related fields, the opportunity to develop career readiness skills such as oral and written communication, leadership, collaboration and problem solving. This certificate will allow you to interact with patients and/or community members, arts in health leaders, artists, healthcare professionals, arts administrators, and non-profit organizations.

The certificate is different than a minor because you get hands-on applied experience. Making the choice to complete the certificate shows intentionality and commitment to interdisciplinary exploration and an awareness of the value of dance to health and well-being in society.

Students should apply by their sophomore year and contact the center undergraduate advisor to schedule an initial meeting to discuss requirements.
