Rationale and Place in Curriculum The HEB minor was cancelled around 2008 due to an exorbitant number of HEB majors, which caused extreme registration difficulty for minor students. The minor was popular, and had 20-30 students enrolled each year. Now that HEB enrollment has both decreased and stabilized, it seems an appropriate time to restart the HEB minor. Additionally, several majors on campus require their students to complete an outside concentration area, which requires typically 9-credits of coursework. Several students choose the Health Education and Behavior coursework as their outside concentration area. Having an established minor will allow these students the option to complete an additional 6-credits of HEB coursework to earn a minor in Health Promotion (while simultaneously completing the requirements for their outside concentration area).

The minor in health promotion is designed to provide a basic understanding of the community health field and an opportunity to gain background in a variety of health issues related to disease prevention and health promotion. Coursework for this minor is focused on health promotion and disease prevention among special target groups within a particular community, with the ultimate goal of providing practical health information to diverse population groups through the use of behavioral interventions.

The minor is open to students of all disciplines classified at the junior and senior levels who achieve and maintain an overall GPA of 2.5 or higher, and no grade below a "C". The minor in health promotion requires the completion of at least 15 credit hours of HSC coursework, as specified below. Students should refer to the course descriptions in the undergraduate catalog for any prerequisites for each course.
