ORCID Resolution – Angela Bacsik

Dean's Report – Judy Russell

- Open Access Funding has received \$120,000 for 4 years. Judy passed out a report drafted by Christine Fruin to show how the money was being allocated. (page 5 & 6)
- Open Access Survey will be coming out soon. This type of survey will help us identify people we can use as examples when we revisit the Open Access Policy.
- High Density Storage – regrouping to discuss funding on this project with the provost, as the intended funding was not received.
- Colonnade Update – libraries is still looking for a donor to fund this project
- Education Library Update – construction will begin on August 1st which will mean the Education Library will be closed. The library will reopen Spring-2018.
- Starbucks at Library West will be expanding and renovating Summer-2017.
- Marston Science Library is going to do a survey on graduate students that use the Graduate Student Space on the 6th floor of Library West. The outcome of the survey should help determine if MSL would create a space like LW.

What is ORCID?

ORCID (Open Researcher and Contributor ID) is a unique identifier associated with a specific author, contributor, or researcher. An ORCID number remains with the researcher throughout his/her career and is independent of organization affiliation. Many funders and publishers require an ORCID number for each researcher associated with a given project or publication. For more information about ORCID visit <http://orcid.org/content/about-orcid>.

Benefits of Using ORCID

An ORCID is important for addressing author disambiguation (different authors with the same name) and linking scholarly publications across multiple systems used by publishers, scholarly societies, funding bodies, and employing institutions.
