Some notes on these statistics:

- 1) We changed databases in the middle of the 2007 – 2008 academic year to a more sophisticated database. We can track more information now. During 2005 – 2006, all Honor Code cases were entered as Honor Code cases and not subdivided by type. In order to determine type, we went through all of those cases and looked at the description to determine whether plagiarism or cheating, etc. Some human error may be involved.
- 2) We changed in the middle of 2007 – 2008 and therefore there may be a few (very small number of) cases that were entered in both databases.
- 3) The Code changed in October 2008. Due to the fact that it was in the middle of a semester, charging occurred in two conduct codes that semester so there may be a few errors and possibly a little double counting (again a small number).
- 4) Numbers were run from 7/1 – 6/30. This also generally coincides with the beginning of Summer B where new students begin their UF careers.
- 5) We only officially started tracking college and some academic unit reports this year, the rest were determined by going back and hand counting so there may be some human error.
- 6) In 2009 – 2010, 199 cases have been reported. 186 have been resolved. 180 found responsible. This means that in 96.7% of cases, students either admit responsibility or are found responsible.
