IDC Process for projects less than \$10K

- Stephanie Gray explained the difference between two different systems in IDCs.
 - The university will subsidize "non-corporate" groups who do not pay IDCs. However, the
 university will not subsidize "corporate" entities that do not offer to pay IDCs; PIs should
 work with DSP on budget development to ensure the request for IDC is included in the
 proposal.
 - o F&A Cost Directives
 - o F&A Policy
 - The RCM model requires 10% of IDC to be paid, regardless of subsidization of IDC within the proposal. The RCM Committee is reviewing revising the IDC policy.

Research Deans
