Liaisons are <u>subject specialist librarians</u> dedicated to specific academic units, including colleges, departments, centers/institutes, and academic programs. Liaisons are the primary contact for their assigned units, and provide a variety of information services to the faculty, students and staff of those units.

Some of the things your Liaison Librarian can do:

- Meet with you in person or over e-mail to discuss any of your information needs
- Provide information consultations or library orientations
- Guest lecture in your class, department/laboratory meeting
- Develop and teach information-related classes workshops on topics such as expert database searching, use of citation management tools, and antiplagiarism strategies
- Create customized online interactive tutorials for use by on- and off-campus faculty, staff & students
- Conduct literature searches
- Help create/update class reading lists
- Provide instruction and consultations
- Assist with the creation of systematic reviews
- Take recommendations for expanding electronic and print resources for the Libraries' collections
