- Selected Highlights for 2018
 - FDA approves Luxturna gene therapy for rare form of inherited vision loss
 - Professor Jack Davis winner of the 2018 Pulitzer Prize in History
 - Record \$837 million in research awards for the fiscal year 2018.
 - UF rises to 8th in US News and World Report ranking of public universities.
 - UF's ambitions are to climb even higher in stature and impact.
 - UF recruiting 500 new faculty members across the institution.

Office of Research working to enhance resources, services, and programs needed to make UF more competitive in research and scholarship relative to our national peers

- Efforts in 2019 to enhance competitiveness:
 - Recruitment of new faculty
 - Partnering with colleges on startup needs
 - Partnering with provost office for improved training for new faculty
 - o Data Science and Information Technology Building
 - Secure additional funding from state for 260,000 sq. ft. research and academic facility
 - o Animal research
 - Continue to improve service and facilities
 - Plan for additional animal research space
 - o Clinical research
 - Support UF Health in drive to secure NCI designation
 - Research computing
 - Planning with UFIT for research computing needs beyond HiperGator 2
 - Research Program Development

 - Multi-investigator program development

- Increase revenue to colleges Address tuition subsidies (waiver of non-resident fee) to research sponsors
 - For many years, UF has elected to waive the non-resident fee for graduate student tuition that is charged to grants
 - Effectively charges grants/contracts the in-state graduate tuition rate for all out-of-state students
 - In-state tuition has also been frozen at current level for 6 years.
 - Caps tuition revenues to colleges to be used to support faculty
 - Compared to our AAU public peers, UF is in the bottom 10 in tuition charged to grants for out-of-state graduate students

- Proposal: Gradually decrease tuition waiver over 6-year period to bring tuition charges to grants/contracts in line with AAU peers
 - Current tuition charge to grants for non-resident graduate student: \$10,771
 - Fall 2019: \$11,848 (10% increase)
 - Fall 2020: \$13,033 (10% increase)
 - Fall 2021: \$14,336 (10% increase)
 - Fall 2022: \$15,769 (10% increase)
 - Fall 2023: \$17,346 (10% increase)
 - Fall 2024: \$18,213 (5% increase)
- Estimated to produce ~ \$5M in additional tuition revenue to colleges
- No effect on tuition charged to grants for in-state students
- No effect on payments made by students (in-state or out-of-state)
