Sustainability Committee

- Support the UF Office of Sustainability initiatives
- Develop, maintain, organize, prioritize and promote a portfolio of sustainable practices
- Encourage and support the development of sustainability education curricula through the following activities, but not limited to: support of the Prairie Project, the STARS tracking process particularly for curricula, providing letters of support for appropriate classes going through the University Curriculum Committee, educating campus about curricular support for Sustainability topics; and restructuring of General Education courses involving sustainability topics.
- Support service, outreach and extension through: involvement in community sustainability efforts by serving on local committees; and serve as a point of contact for community members seeking information on sustainability initiatives.
- The group also voted to form a Summer Task Force to continue work over the summer semester

IT Committee

- The Deans adopted Canvas at their last meeting.
- Transition from Sakai to Canvas will take about two years.

- The CMS Adhoc committee chaired by Ray Issa recommendation Canvas
- Students did not care when surveyed which CMS they preferred.. Faculty who have taught on both Sakai and Canvas prefer Canvas
- IT will offer Canvas face to face and video training. Workshops will start July 1.
- IT has been investing \$1million each year to remodel centralized classrooms. So far one third have been remodeled. IT will do 62 more this year, another 100 classrooms next year, and start the rotation again after that.
- Working on providing technology for the Marston Library renovation.
- Access to wireless in the Health Science Center should be easier and made a \$9 million investment in the stadium.
