    - Libraries need \$2.03 M increase to simply maintain current content and \$3.4 M increase to restore funding to FY 2008-2009 levels
    - Updated Peer Analysis to Support Library Funding indicated correlation between total university expenditures and library expenditures at US public university peer institutions is 0.87 whereas at UF correlation is 0.15
  - Open Access
    - No new funding provided to restart Open Access Publishing Fund
    - Campus wide adoption of Open Access Policy deferred pending additional education and outreach to Faculty
