#### **Contributing Committee Reports**

### • Senate Meeting (S) – Ann Wehmeyer

- o Dr. Wehmeyer met with Faculty Senate Chair Stedman about Infrastructure Council's inability to give a recommendation on a centralizing the university's room/space reservations. Too many entities on campus own rooms/space and charge for their usage.
- o Dr. Stedman plans to talk with Charlie Lane, COO about the space issue.
- Suggestions for a work around:
  - Ask the Provost to create a special seminar fund to assist departments and faculty when hosting seminars and conferences on campus.
  - Bring up this issue with the Provost at the Steering Committee

#### • University Libraries Committee - Angela Bacsik

- o Angela Bacsik distributed a <u>draft resolution and information on ORCID</u>
- ORCID is a unique identifier associated with a specific author, contributor, or researcher. The ORCID remains with the researcher throughout his/her career and is independent of organization affiliation. ORCID is a non-for-profit organization, sustained by fees from members organizations.
- Lakes, Vegetation, and Landscaping Committee Gail Hansen (not in attendance)
  - o Committee has not met since last Infrastructure Council meeting

#### • Parking and Transportation (J) – Ray Thomas

- Alpha Epsilon Phi sorority is undergoing major renovations and wants to increase space.
  Currently parking is along SW 9<sup>th</sup> Street with students jumping the curb to park
- o There is concern about Alpha Chi Omega students backing up onto SW 13<sup>th</sup> street.
- Parking received a request for special parking for expectant mothers.
  - The university will accommodate expectant mothers with special medical conditions.
- o Institutes of Black and Hispanic Culture asked for a few parking changes.
- o Parking decals for faculty and staff will increase about 7% for 2017-2018.
- Parking garage is planned for the parking lot across from the Welcome Center.
- o Plans are to install another electrical charging station.
- o Concern was raised about the foot traffic in front of Smathers when it rains. The Krishnas serve food under the overhang causing a bottleneck in that area.
- More concerns: Service vehicles park on the sidewalks causing pedestrians to walk on the street.

- Land Use and Facilities Planning Committee (J) Megan Forbes
  - o Approved UF-620 Bee Unit Facility on the east side of entomology
  - o Approved the Career Resource Center Expansion and Renovation
  - o Looking for a chiller plant location
  - o Deciding about the Veterinary School's surface parking lot
- Faculty IT Committee (S) Michael Dark
  - o The committee will review the Academic Analytics collaboration tool on Friday
