Faculty Benefit Restructuring: Update

Mark Heft gave a brief update from the Budget Council. He explained that the Budget Council has spent most of its time working on RCM. Benefits restructuring is currently in limbo due to the lawsuit against the state about employees paying 3% toward their retirement.

Self-Insurance Study: Update

Marvin Dewar and Paula Fussell updated the council on the self-insurance study. A minimum of 10 work groups are currently meeting, along with 22 focus groups with 200-300 people providing feedback. Several of the focus participants fear that they will be forced to get health care at Shands. Another fear is that some of the same coverage will not be available. Buck Consultants is available to aid groups, not write or make recommendations on the proposal. Most of the groups are self-sufficient, while others have asked for data from the consultants for data. So far, we are receiving fantastic feedback.
