

Faculty lounges and clubs

Summary

Funding of faculty clubs has been done by several methods. First, they are constructed as part of new facilities for students such as student unions, libraries, or cafeterias. Secondly, they are constructed stand alone with funds secured through bonds. The cost of facilities is usually not available or the buildings are old and remodeled. Additionally, some universities have one small building while others include recreation facilities, dining rooms and additional amenities. Some costs start at \$1 million to \$2 million for remodeling. Several faculty clubs were built with donations of significant private donations.

Initiation fees may be several hundred dollars to as low as \$20. Monthly dues range from \$20 up to \$100
