








- Review/Enhancement of Protocol for Event Management
- Changes in UFPD Use of Force Policy

Pre-Event Planning

Established formal training for:

- UFPD employees
- Event staff
- Sponsoring organizations staff
- Dean's office staff

Emphasis on planning meetings:


All groups involved must meet prior to events

On-site roll call training:

- Staff assignments
- Building logistics
- Direct communication with facility staff
