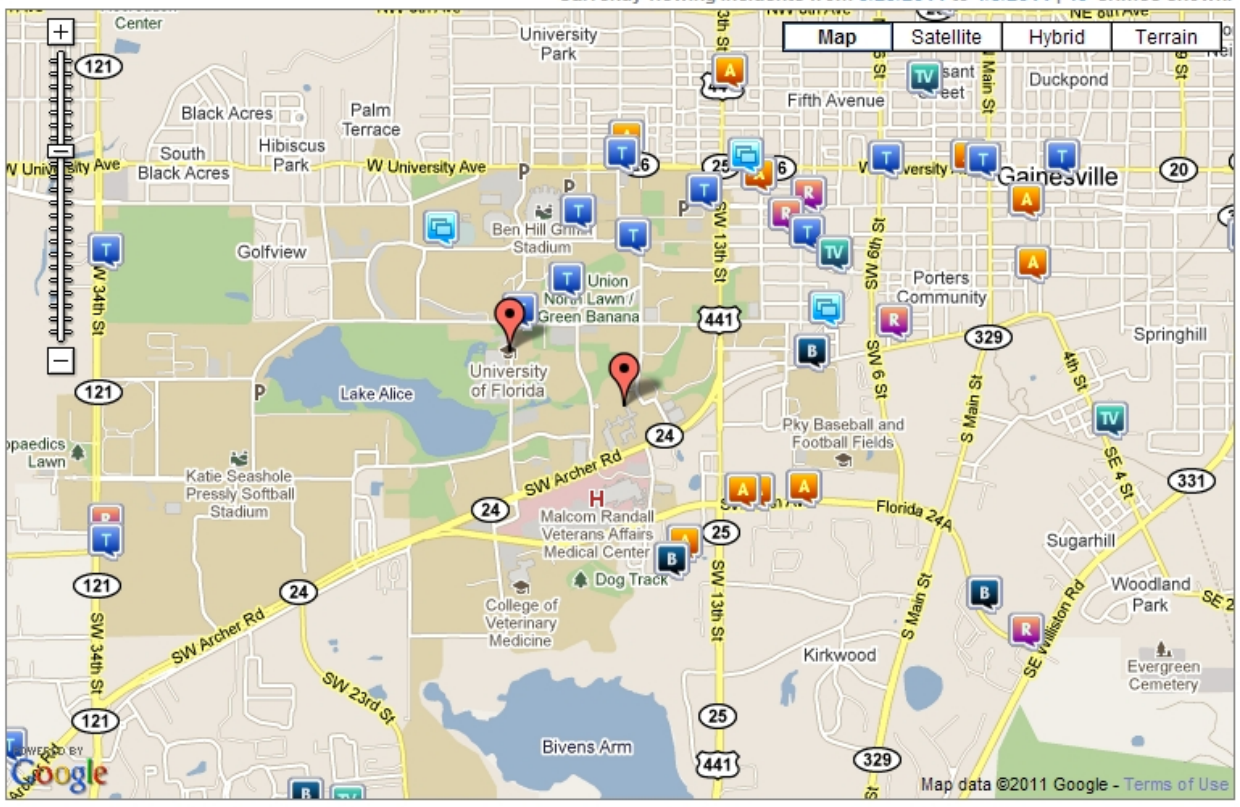

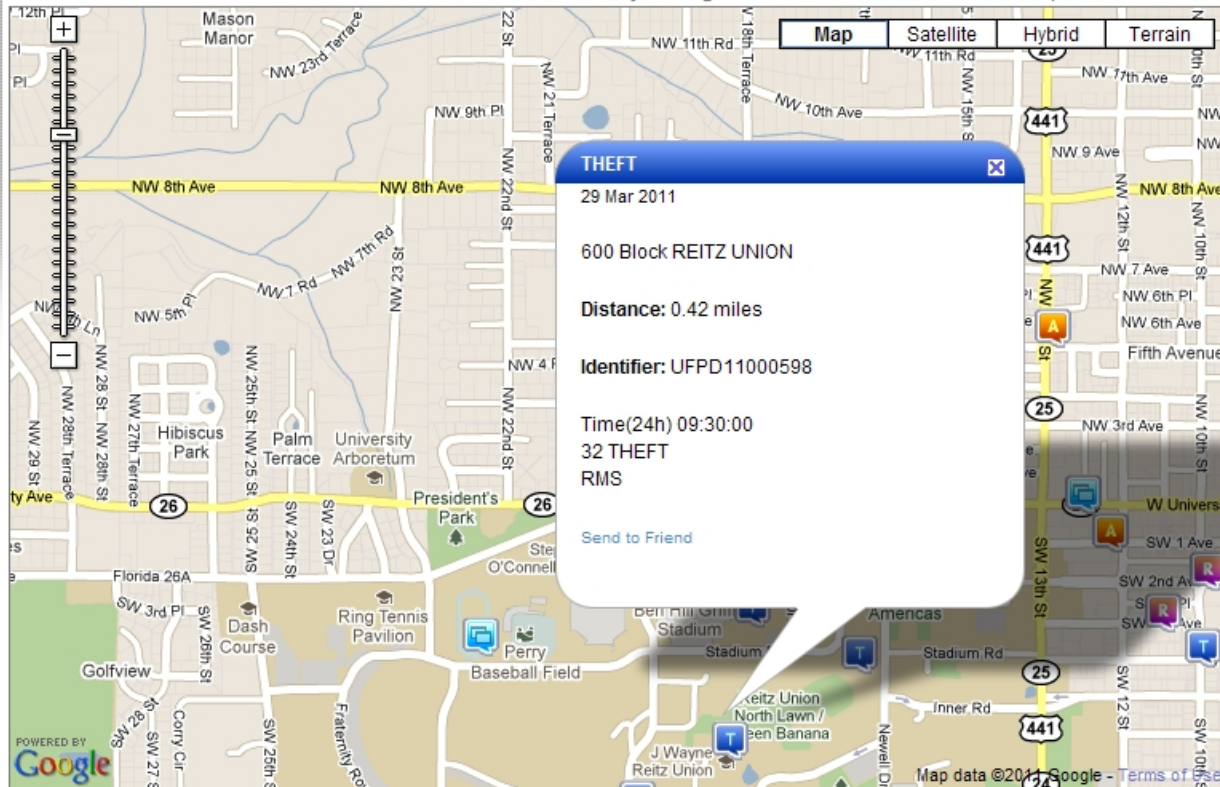

- Police Academy Training  180 hours
- UFPD Training for New Hires  20 hours
- UFPD Annual In-Service Training  20 hours

Important Changes Affecting UFPD Use of Force

- Improved Pre-Event Planning
- Review/Enhancement of Protocol for Event Management
- Changes in UFPD Use of Force Policy

Pre-Event Planning

Established formal training for:

- UFPD employees
- Event staff
- Sponsoring organizations staff
- Dean's office staff

Emphasis on planning meetings:

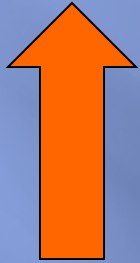
- All groups involved must meet prior to events

On-site roll call training:

- Staff assignments
- Building logistics
- Direct communication with facility staff

- In compliance with state law.
- In compliance with UFPD directives.
- Reasonable and necessary.
