- There will be an open faculty forum sponsored by the Faculty Senate on May 29 to discuss the budget.

- IAC is a Presidential Committee recommending policy changes, providing oversight, and monitors rules, etc.
- Committee has met four times this academic year. Some of the action items before the committee were:
 - Reviewed the APR (academic progress rate) and GSR (graduation success rate) data trends
 - Academic major clustering of student-athletes
 - Tutor survey
 - NCAA reform updates
 - Development of an enhanced <u>website</u>
- Mike Sagas is the Faculty Athletics Representative. This position is a member of the faculty who is a liaison between athletics and the institution and is an official representative of the institution in NCAA affairs.
- University of Florida rates second in the Southeastern Conference GSR Ratings.

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• UF Men's baseball, basketball, football and tennis teams have a multiyear APR greater than the NCAA Division I APR as of 2009-2010. For the same year, all UF women's teams had a multiyear APR great greater than the NCAA Division 1 APR.

President's Report

Bernie Machen, President

President Machen explained that cuts have been up and available at the Dean's level for over a month. By the end of this week, the Provost should have college and administrative unit proposals for final review. The Board of Trustees meets in about a month and President Machen is impressed with the work done by the deans and administrators to deal with some difficult issues. The university is reviewing the proposed cuts and how that will impact the local units and the institution. The BOG will not make a decision about the undergraduate tuition

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increase until next month. This is a great opportunity for dialogue and to point out negative impacts on institutional mission areas.

Budget Discussion

- Some faculty of the College of Fine Arts are concerned that they have not participated in shared governance and what will happen during the summer. Provost Glover pointed out that he attended a College of Fine Arts college-wide meeting. The Dean showed her budget proposal and everyone had a chance to comment on it. The college has a significant budget issue, more than other colleges, and the administration is work to find a solution.
- The Pre-eminence bill passed overwhelmingly by the legislature, support by the Board of Governor and backed by other universities. The Governor vetoed the bill. The university will continue to try again on pre-eminence.
- All the different self-insurance plans that the university has already (about 10-15,000 people) will be wrapped up into Gatorcare. The university will continue with Gatorcare but with a smaller group than what was originally planned. State employees will not be a part of Gatorcare at this time.
- Chair Nygren introduced Kelsey Antle, graduate assistant, who spoke for the graduate students. Kelsey explained that the graduate students are concerned about the college wide cuts in the College of Liberal Arts and Sciences. The graduate students have 10 demands in an effort to attain the college's mission.
 - Honor graduate student's contracts as written.
 - Ensure funding for international students who cannot legally work anywhere outside of the University.
 - Argue that the University leadership should utilize the reserves to prevent lay-offs and graduate student funding cuts.
 - Make publicly available all budget data, financial models and correspondences that were considered when building the budget cut plan proposed for May 11, 2012.
 - Commission and make public a long-term economic impact analysis and a job market analysis, as well as an analysis of the projected reputation and research impact upon the University of Florida, of the budget cut plan proposed for May 11, 2012.
 - Publicly pledge not to institute any unjustified cuts, recurring and otherwise, to CLAS.
 - o Maintain and/or reinstate all CLAS staff members currently on notice for termination.
 - Publicly pledge not to "lay off", "fire", or otherwise eliminate staff and their positions from CLAS unless such actions are mutually agreed upon by the CLAS faculty and individual department administration.
 - Create and publicly present at least three separate budget cut proposals for discussion.
 - In addition to the stipulations outlined in Article VI 1.e of the Constitution of the University of Florida regarding shared governance, we require a democratic ³/₄ majority vote of approval from faculty and graduate students in the units affected for the current and any future budget proposals to take effect.

The meeting adjourned at 4:30 p.m.
