Faculty Senate Meeting Minutes February 26, 2015 3:00 – 5:00 p.m. Reitz Union Auditorium

Pradeep Kumar, chair, called the meeting to order at 3:04 p.m. He reminded the Senate that if members wish to participate in discussion that they should go to one of the two microphones in the aisles and identify themselves first.

January 2015 minutes were approved.

Chair's Report

Pradeep Kumar, Faculty Senate Chair

• Chair Kumar introduced President Fuchs. This is the first time that the new president has attended a Senate meeting. The Board of Governors has meetings during the same time as the Senate this semester, so President Fuchs has had a conflict. The Senate rescheduled the February 19th meeting to February 26 so that the president could attend.

President's Report

Kent Fuchs, President

- President Fuchs stated that during the first couple months of his appointment he plans to listen and learn along with
 - Building personal relationships with the legislature in Tallahassee.
 - Been building relationships with alumni of the university
 - Working hard to be accessible with the student body
 - Plans are to visit each of the colleges and schools.
- The university will launch a process next month documenting the university's aspirations for five years and ten years. The process will be at the university level and as inclusive as possible.
 - Provost Glover will communicate with the Deans that this will be done at the college level.
 - This process will be connected to a fund raising campaign that will be launched in a year or so.
- Senators asked several questions.
 - Alice Rhoton hoped that the university reinvigorates the importance of education for undergraduate students.
 - Beverly Sanders asked about UFOnline
 - Bruce Welt was curious about an article that mentioned anti-semitism at Cornell and Columbia.
 - Clay Calvert wondered what surprised the President about the university and out of state tuition.

Provost's Report

Joe Glover, Provost

- Provost Glover noted that the University has had a program for increasing diversity in the freshman class during the past five years. Several years ago the out-of-state freshman class was 5% and the current incoming class is 10%.
- Searches:
 - Search for the CLAS Dean is near the end. This past week the President and Provost have met with the CLAS search advisory committee. There are three strong candidates.
 - College of Law Dean search is a little behind. The Search Committee received the portfolio of all candidates for the position.
- Discussions have started in Tallahassee around the budget.

- The Governor and Board of Governors have taken a position that there will not be any tuition increases this year.
- The university hopes that the state will put another 100 million dollars into performance funding.
- UF is asking for another \$10 million in preeminence funding.
- Questions from Senators.
 - Ray Thomas noted that at the last Infrastructure Council meeting concern was raised about the building maintenance such as leaking roofs and lack of heating. Provost Glover explained that the legislature is still trying to find a PECO substitute for building maintenance for the universities.

Curriculum Committee

Bernard Mair, Associate Provost Undergraduate Affairs

Pradeep Kumar, Chair

- <u>Unified Elementary/Special Education</u> ProTeach Credit change
 This item was approved.
- <u>Revision of Honor Roll and Dean's List Policy</u>
 - This item was approved.

Concealed Weapons on Campus Resolution

- Chair Kumar explained that there is a bill proposed before the legislature which takes away exemption of college campuses of the concealed carry law which would allow people to carry weapons on campus.
- The Senate Steering Committee passed a resolution that opposes this. The two bills before the legislature is House Bill 4005 and Senate Bill 176. The Steering Committee resolution is based on the resolution that the Senate passed in 2011. A motion was made and seconded to approve the proposed resolution.
 - Discussion:
 - Sylvain Dore (COM) asked that he would like an amendment to add to the resolution title:
 - And Increasing Effort to Update Training for First Responders states:
 - Then end the resolution with:
 - BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that we want to ensure that increasing effort is deployed to provide updated and sustained training to all first responders, including UF police and Gainesville and Alachua security officers, who are employed and trained to secure our safety should an emergency arise.
 - A motion was made and seconded to approve the amendment.
 - David Groisser agrees with the spirit of the content but thinks that the proposed amendment should be part of a separate resolution.
 - The amendment did not pass.
 - Bruce Welt gave a <u>power point presentation</u> against the resolution.
 - He noted that responsible adults follow the rules and criminals, lunatics and terrorists don't.
 - Murder Rates have fallen as the percentage of the adult population with permitted concealed handguns has increased.
 - Maggie Temple-Smith spoke for the resolution. She is concerned about guns scattered around campus. She is also worried that those who carry weapons

are not expert shots, would panic in emergency situations and shoot innocent people instead of the intruder.

- David Groisser agreed with Maggie Temple-Smith. He is concerned about the proliferation of guns on campus and shootings.
- Ray Thomas stated that personal security is a basic natural right. He noted that this resolution will do nothing to prevent the heinous acts of deranged criminals. It will only serve to deny the right of law abiding citizens.
- Julie Dodd from the College of Journalism and Communications at its last meeting voted unanimously in support of a motion very similar to the resolution before the senate. She stated that her college would support this resolution.
- Bruce Welt pointed out that this resolution does not stop the shooting of a professor. He stated that voting for this resolution would deny the right to defend yourself if someone came in and starting shooting.
- The motion to approve the February 2015 Resolution Against Guns on Campus was passed (Approve 75 [66 onsite and 9 offsite] Against: 11 [7 onsite and 4 offsite])

Resolution Against Guns on Campus

WHEREAS, a civil, safe and open environment is fundamental to the educational and research mission of the University of Florida, and

WHEREAS guns, including legally purchased guns, have been involved in numerous unfortunate incidents on college campuses around the country in which students, faculty and staff have been injured and killed; and

WHEREAS, numerous studies have determined that possession of guns greatly increases the risk that innocent people will be shot, and

WHEREAS, Florida Senate Bill SB176 and House Bill HB 4005 was filed to amend Florida Statute 790.06 to allow the possession of firearms by non-law enforcement officials on university and college campuses, and

WHEREAS, the vast majority of the state of Florida educational and law enforcement professionals believe that prohibiting firearms on college campuses except by trained security officers is an essential element of overall school safety plan;

THEREFORE, LET IT BE RESOLVED that the Faculty Senate of the University of Florida, on behalf of the faculty of the University of Florida, strongly opposes SB 176, HB 4005, and any other legislation that would preempt an educational institution's right to prohibit or regulate possession of firearms on campus.
