

Facts about Concealed Carry

- Must be > 21 years old!
- Concealed weapons are concealed!
- Brandishing a gun is a felony.
- Must have permit
- Not convicted of felony
- Not mentally impaired/deficient
- Not habitual alcohol/drug user



Active Shooter Threat Increasing An unfortunate <u>reality</u>


A Study of 160 Active Shooter Incidents in the United States Between 2000 - 2013: Annual Totals of 1,043 Casualties



Lott and Mustard (2013) – issuance of millions of

permits to carry concealed handguns is associated with drastic declines in American homicide rates.

Murder Rates have fallen as the Percentage of the Adult Population with Permitted Concealed Handguns has increased



INCIDENTS WITH THE HIGHEST CASUALTY COUNTS:

- Cinemark Century 16 Theater in Aurora, Colorado: 70 (12 killed, 58 wounded), July 20, 2012.
- Virginia Polytechnic Institute and State University in Blacksburg, Virginia: 49 (32 killed, 17 wounded), April 16, 2007.¹²
- Ft. Hood Soldier Readiness Processing Center in Ft. Hood, Texas: 45 (13 killed, 32 wounded), November 5, 2009.
- Sandy Hook Elementary School and a residence in Newtown, Connecticut: 29 (27 killed, 2 wounded), December 14, 2012.

60.0% of the incidents ended before police arrived!

Conclusions – FBI Study

Even when law enforcement was present or able to respond within minutes, <u>civilians</u> <u>often had to make life and death decisions,</u> <u>and, therefore, should be engaged in</u> <u>training and discussions on decisions they</u> <u>may face.¹⁷</u>
