• President's Report

Kent Fuchs, President

- o President Fuchs received an award from *Sunshine State News* for the tweet of the week which spotlighted both Professor Jack E. Davis, who just won the Pulitzer Prize for his book *The Gulf: The Making of an American Sea* and Ibram X. Kendi, UF Assistant Professor of African American History, who won the 2016 National Book Award for Nonfiction.
- An update of university searches was given, including: Chief Diversity Officer, which has been narrowed to the final three candidates; and VP of General Counsel, VP of Strategic Marketing and Communications, and VP of Government and Community Relations, all three of which will continue through the month of May when finalists will be announced. Faculty feedback is encouraged through participation at the open forums and via the search committee chairs.

The Graduate Council recommends acceptance of a proposal from the College of Public Health and Health Professions to reduce the required credit hours by one for this master's degree. This item was approved.

OPS (Other Personnel Services) Resolution

David M. Quillen, Faculty Senate Chair

- O Jodi Gentry, VP of Human Resource Services, provided a brief history and overview of university practices and policies related to OPS personnel and relayed the following information:
 - Department and work units primarily manage and oversee OPS personnel; it is and has been a highly de-centralized process.
 - UF spends approximately \$84 million annually on OPS non-student employees, of which there are approximately 3,000.
 - UF HR is working with VP's, deans, and college staff to better categorize OPS employment.
 Each college is being asked to evaluate its OPS roles and the appropriateness of a TEAMS vs.
 OPS position.
 - As a public employer, the university cannot convert an OPS employee to a TEAMS employee without a recruitment process.
 - There is some concern about possible unintended consequences of changes to current OPS practices, such as: units losing the ability to nimbly and quickly fill job openings; and unintentionally making OPS-turned-TEAMS positions highly competitive, thereby possibly risking the job of the current OPS job-holder.
- O Q&A included the following information:
 - An OPS review process is being put in place by the university and includes a review of why an employee may have remained in an OPS position for a designated amount of time.
 - The one-year standard mentioned in the resolution is the standard used by the Dept. of Labor for its own employees but the type of job and source of funding are the two primary factors which drive university OPS designation.
 - In UF's shared governance model, this Senate resolution is a recommendation, rather than a binding policy.
 - The resolution's verbiage of one year (versus long term and/or full time OPS employment at the university) and its broadness and possible pre-maturity (i.e. should the issue be further studied before a vote is taken) was also discussed.
 - This resolution was forwarded and unanimously supported by the Infrastructure Council.

 University Constitution and Regulations Committee Chair Richard Scholtz presented the committee's proposed <u>Faculty Senate bylaws changes</u>. - Faculty member Laurie Taylor expressed appreciation to the Senate for their support of the OPS resolution, as well as to Graduate Assistants United, United Faculty of Florida, and UF Student Government, who have also extended expressions of support to OPS personnel, and to the Senate committees and councils, and VP Gentry for sharing information.
- College of Medicine Senator Tammy Euliano expressed dismay over the P.K. Yonge tradition of replacing the words "the home of the brave" with "the home of the wave" (i.e. a reference to their school mascot The Blue Wave) during the singing of the national anthem at P.K. Yonge events. While this item may be considered a minor one, there is a concern that this may be disrespectful to our veterans, country, and active military personnel. College of Education Senator Jim Bice, who is an Instructor at the P.K. Yonge Developmental Research School at the University of Florida, responded that he was unaware of this practice but will bring it to the attention of PK Yonge and will relay their response at the next Senate meeting.
