- February 2023

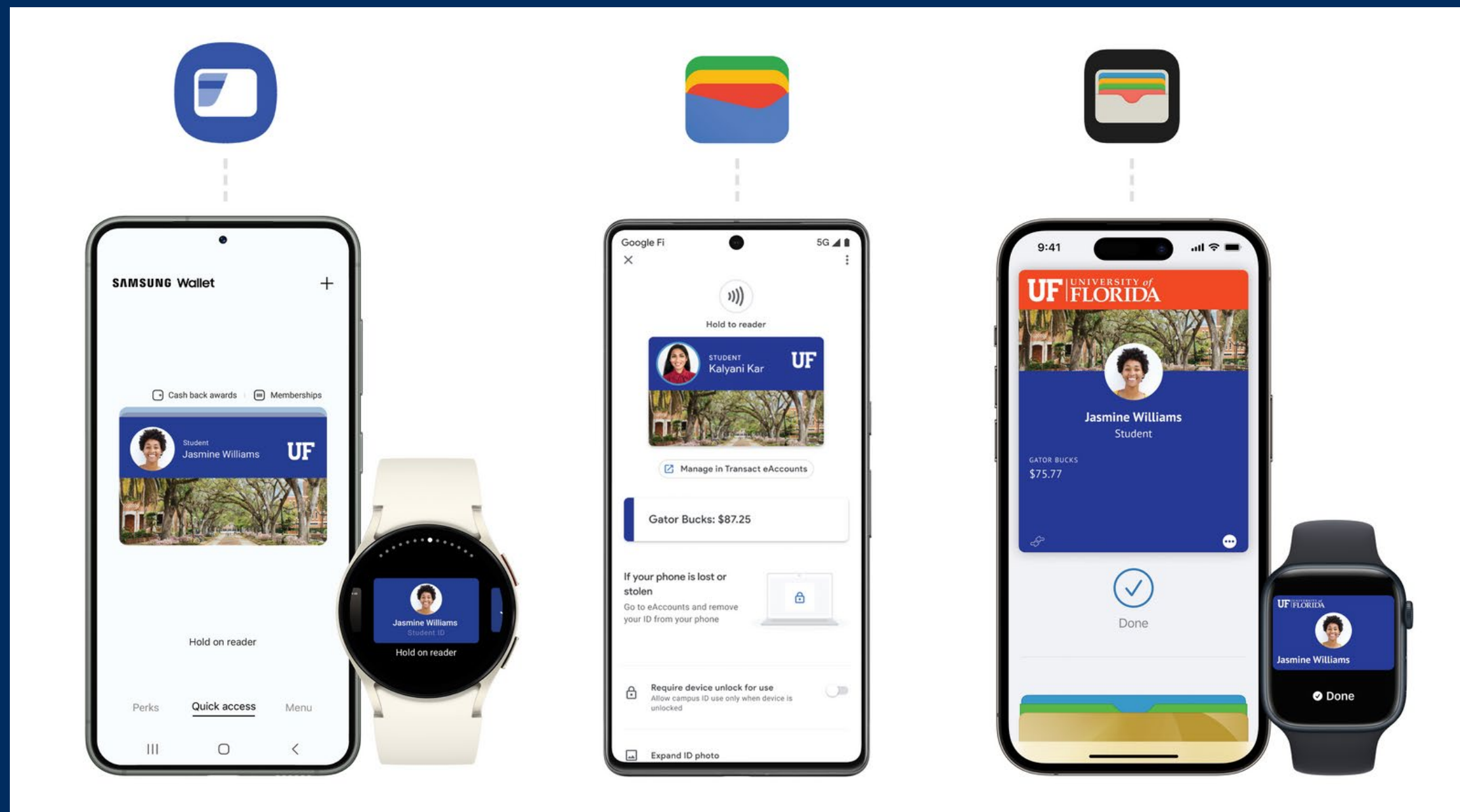


Faster, more secure transactions.

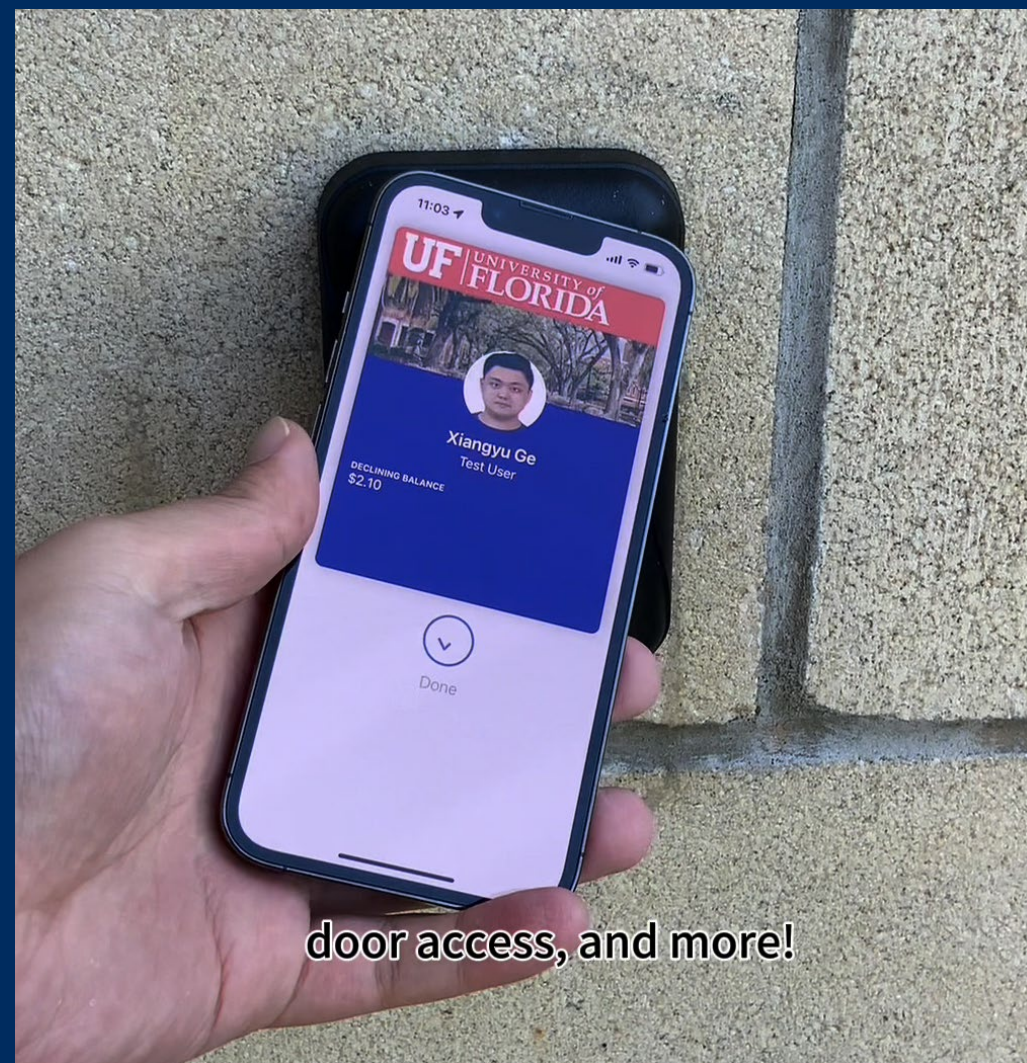

Door Reader Upgrades

Once the project is complete, the old **GATOR 1** cards can no longer be used for door access at UF buildings. All readers will be tap (NFC) only; no mag swipe.



- UF Buildings - 85% (124/146)
UF HSC Buildings - 0/15
- Shands - no current plans for door reader upgrades

The Plan for Shands/HSC

Shands

Short-term: Partner with HR/ID badging office

- Issue the same NFC card technology as UF, i.e. the Shands badge design would be printed on a UF card

Long-term: UF/Shands collaborate on strategy to reduce number of IDs/combine access credentials

Note: Shands employees are not eligible for the mobile ID unless also a UF employee

The Plan for Shands/HSC

HSC

- All new UF HSC employees and students receive a physical card, mobile ID, and overlay badge (if required).
- Existing employees/students are eligible for the mobile ID and new card (at no cost).
- Install new door readers at HSC late fall/early spring

New Card? Mobile? Or Both?

Overall UF strategy: Mobile-first

UF Students:

- All new students receive mobile IDs (cards by exception only)
- Existing students who already have a card can also have a mobile ID

New Card? Mobile? Or Both?

Overall UF strategy: Mobile-first

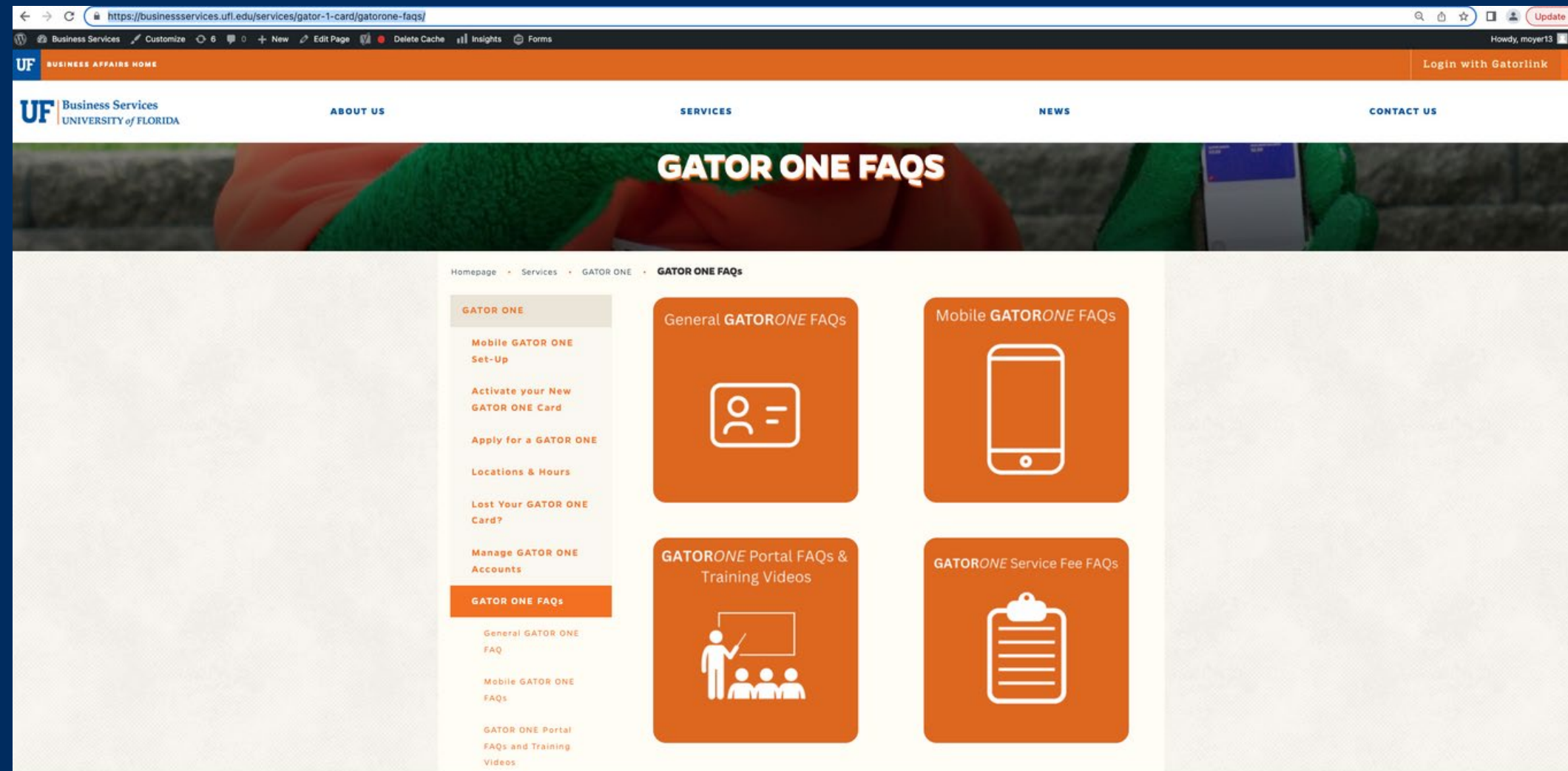
UF Employees:

- Depends on job needs and physical environment
- A phone/mobile ID may not be the best option for clinical settings or research environments
- The old and new card designs will continue to work for wearable ID purposes

2. Is this for building-wide access or is there a means to have individual rooms (computer lab, for instance) so that we can eliminate keys for all student researchers and employees?
