- Board of Trustees had requested a process of holistic review for Preview and a WorkGroup along with Preview Partners group was formed and has been collaborating on:
 - Timeline for tangibles (formalize learning outcomes and goals of Preview from the student perspective as well as from the institutional standpoint, finalize Preview Calendar for dates/sessions, etc.)
 - Aim to distribute calendar sometime in February
