2. Campus Assistance & Resources for Empowerment (CARE) Presentation

Nadene Reynolds, Assistant Dean of Students & Director of CARE

- Serves as a gateway to the university of Florida 2 main areas SCCR and CARE
 - Known for medical petitions, no longer CARE Team wants it to be known as case management services
 - Programs include Field and Fork Pantry, Collegiate Veterans Success Center, Medical Petitions, and Case Management Services
 - Services and resources U Matter, We Care and instructor Notifications
 - People Nadene Reynolds (Danielle Martinez is moving away from DSO but still at UF in a new role in behavioral assessment). Case managers Sara Donals, Kofi Boateng. Lisa Duffy med pets, CVSC and field and fork is Roselind Brown. Three open positions hopefully filling soon.
- Field and Fork (renovated in 2019) monthly distribution had been 7k pounds per month and is now at 7k lbs per week. Eighty percent of volume is student utilization. Consider volunteering or organizing a food drive!
- Collegiate Veterans Success Center = in Yon Hall 418. Space dedicated to creating connection, support, and resources for the UF military. 1800-2500 students using VA/military benefits in any given year. Vet Success On Campus Counselor: patricia.carswell@va.gov offers VA benefits counseling including education and medical assistance. Office of Student Veteran Services vacounselor@ufl.edu (for ed benefit requests).
- Case Management Services operates in a non clinical capacity. Personalized Outreach(, Supportive Connections, Follow up/Resolution (confirm stu has met outlined goals), Instructor Notifications (communicates short term absences for difficult circumstances – not excusing an absence)
- Medical Petitions Volunteer. Dates and times are flexible through entire academic year.

- Instructor Notifications (come from <u>notifications@maxient.com</u>). Documentation is required for requests. Instructor notifications are not required. They can be requested, accepted, or denied at the instructor's discretion.
- U Matter We Care.
 - DSO moving back to Peabody on 10/24 and 10/25, so there may be some delay as they set up again in their space.

- QUESTION: If a student wants a medical withdraw, what is the time frame to see updates?
 - Depends on time of the semester, sometimes 4-6 weeks, peak times 6-10wks. Students need to submit their med pet within 6 months of the end of the semester they are petitioning for (not start it, but fully submit) to retain eligibility for fee repayment.
- QUESTION: How can advisors alleviate burden on DSO?
 - Continue to refer, remind students that there are a number of units on campus that are there to support them, be there for your student, be familiar with the DSO website and how to navigate.
- Accommodations from DRC should always be accepted. If you aren't sure how to meet that, connect with the DRC.
- Instructor Notifications they ask faculty to be flexible.
- QUESTION: Checking medical petition status in the system?
 - If you don't know how, you can go ahead and message Mike and he'll teach you!
